

Wool-weight, (-wāt.) (*Camb.*) Bales of wool vary in weight according to the custom of the country where they are packed and whence they are exported. Thus, in the U. States, England, and the English colonies, the pound avoirdupois is the current weight; in S. America, the arroba; and in Russia, the pood. In the English trade, however, there are weights used in excess of the lb., as the *clove* (7 lbs.), the *stone* (14 lbs.), the *tod* (28 lbs.), the *wey* (182 lbs.), the *pack* (240 lbs.), &c.
